PROGRAM POLICIES

Majors must achieve a minimum G.P.A of 2.0 in Psychology courses. Students must earn a grade of C or higher in each PSY course or prerequisite course that they take. If the course serves as a prerequisite for another, they must earn at least a C to advance in the sequence. Psychology majors should meet with their academic advisor each semester to discuss scheduling of classes in light of specific career goals.

Each course in the major is taught in both fall and spring semesters ¹ Students may opt to take CM 115 Interpersonal Communications instead of CM 101.

- Specific courses that fulfill SEE general education requirements are listed in the catalog and on the portal.
- Students must complete all general education and major requirements and earn a minimum of 120 credits.
- 15 credits must be taken at the 300 or 400 level.
- All courses in the student's last 30 credits must be taken at Stevenson.
- *HUMANITIES classes must be from at least three different disciplines.
- **SOCIAL SCIENCE classes must be from two different disciplines.
