When a grade below a "C" is earned in a major course, the student must repeat that course. A course may be repeated once without special permission.

BA Option: Students also have the option of completing a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology. The student must fulfill all SEE requirements, program requirements, and complete two semesters of a foreign language from the point of placement or completion of 202 level.
