No student, regardless of major, will be permitted to advance to the next course without earning a grade of "C" or better in the prerequisite course(s). When a grade below a "C" is earned in a major course, the student must repeat that course. A course may be repeated once without special permission.

- 36 credits for the major selected from a minimum of two disciplines, identified as content areas
- Minimum of 12 credits for a program content area
- Minimum of 18 upper level credits from the program content areas
- Minimum of 30 total upper level credits

**BA Option:** Students also have the option of completing a Bachelor of Arts degree in Interdisciplinary Studies. The student must fulfill all SEE requirements, program requirements, and complete two semesters of a foreign language from the point of placement or completion of 202 level.

- Students must complete all SEE and major requirements and earn a minimum of 120 credits.
- A minimum of 15 credits must be taken at the 300/400 level.
